Assignment Design Workshop May 11

Participants in this workshop will learn how transparent assignments can:

- Serve as a 'roadmap' for students, providing them with a greater opportunity for successfully meeting the expectations of the assignment.
- Benefit all student groups, with particular benefit to underrepresented student groups, in terms of achievement, retention and graduation rates, and students' confidence and sense of belonging.
- Demystify the learning process for students who may be less familiar with college success strategies.

This workshop will take place on **Friday**, **May 11** from **10am - 2pm** in CUE 518 on the Pullman campus. Lunch will be included, and participants will have the opportunity to discuss and revise a current assignment.
