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Thank You: 2022 Undergraduate Degree Program Assessment Reporting

We'd like to extend our appreciation to all faculty and chairs/directors who invested time in undergraduate program assessment activities, as well as into annual degree program assessment reporting for 2022. In April, assessment coordinators and chairs/directors will receive a PDF copy of their final report via email for their continued use and archive.

As we do each year, we will compile the data from the 2022 undergraduate program assessment reports and produce summaries for WSU, college, and campus leadership, as well as for our university-wide archives that provide evidence of assessment activities in support of university accreditation. The annual WSU-wide summary of undergraduate program assessment reports is also published on the ACE website each fall—keep an eye out for an announcement in a future issue of the ACE Assessment Digest!

As faculty and leadership engage in program-level assessment over time, and work to improve the quality and utility of their assessment elements, we are collectively developing mature, meaningful systems that meet the evolving needs of WSU students, faculty and disciplines. Reminder: Please Help Promote NSSE 2023 in March and into April

In March, eligible seniors and first-year students on all WSU campuses are receiving emails on behalf of WSU President Kirk Schulz asking that they respond to the <u>National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE</u>), with up to four weekly reminder emails. This survey collects input from seniors and first-year students about their academic experience at WSU and in their major, and asks seniors about future plans.

NSSE opened on March 1 and remains open through the end of the semester; however, students must complete the survey by April 15th to be eligible for the drawings for the \$100 Visa gift cards. Regular reminders to students in March and into April about NSSE would be greatly appreciated. After each administration, our office collaborates with WSU's Office of Institutional Research to disaggregate results for undergraduate degree programs and colleges, focusing on responses from seniors. These disaggregated NSSE reports are distributed to WSU programs in which 10 or more seniors respond to survey. 	Late Feb	Spring 2023 [CAPS] instructors receive an email from UCORE with initial information about [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE for the spring term.
	28 th	2022 Undergraduate Program Assessment Reports are due (i.e., reporting closes). Assessment coordinators (or another knowledgeable assessment contact) need to be available to answer questions until March 31 st .
March	1 st – 31 st	Main window for <u>NSSE 2023 promotion</u> . Note: NSSE remains open through the end of the semester; however, students must complete the survey by April 15th to be eligible for the drawings for the \$100 Visa gift cards.
April	14 th	Deadline for undergraduate students to withdraw from a course.
	Mid to Late April	Each program will receive a PDF copy of their final 2022 Undergraduate Program Assessment Report from ACE for their continued use and archive.
